
- 1.) Your mission is to create your own PowerPoint slide, **ONE SLIDE** which will have the three components of composition: TEXT, IMAGE(S), and FOOTNOTES.
- 2.) The theme will be a biography summary of a woman featured on the National Women’s History Museum site.
- 3.) Spend no more than 5 – 10 choosing a woman.
- 4.) Read the information provided on this site.
- 5.) **Text:** On PAPER briefly summarize the information (main idea, supporting idea(s), and supporting details). Be careful. Are these your words or will you be quoting **part** of the information? **You may QUOTE the article only ONCE.**
- 6.) Open up a PowerPoint document. Create a text box and type in your summary. Review and edit. Remember to give your slide a title.
- 7.) **Images:** Use of the image in the biography is a possibility, but footnote its original location on the web. (Use your school’s standard footnote format.) Right Click on the image and copy it into the PowerPoint.
